Dear Mr. Willson:

The legislature took a recess from Friday afternoon until tomorrow at 4 P. M. Consequently, things are quiet here at present.

I have heard from our office, and they would like me to return to complete some important matters, when I will be free to come back here. They are desirous, however, that I should not leave this end uncovered. If, therefore, you can arrange to handle the proposition during my absence, we will be glad to cover your expenses. Can you do this? Please let me know. I would like to leave here on the 13th instant, if it will be convenient for you to come. It may be that the legislature will take a similar recess next week, in which case you would not need to get here until the 15th or 16th.

In the meantime, we are going to try to get the Committee hearings set for this week, and if that goes through, there are certain advantages in having a Floridian putting the proposition up to members of the Legislature rather than a "foreigner."
