Dear Mr. Spencer:-

About a month ago, when I had the pleasure of seeing you in your office, you were about to start for Key West, from there you thought you might go to Ft. Myers, - to the Indian's new reservation then to Tallahassee and see if the Board of Internal Improvement, had conveyed the land to the Trustees of State Institutions as provided for in the Bill.

If you went to Tallahassee, and also to see the land, I would be very glad indeed to have any information you can give me. How do the Indians you have seen and told about the land since the bill passed, take the matter?

You doubtless have a lot of negatives of pictures you have taken of the Indians from time to time, - could I borrow them for a short time? I would take good care of them and return them promptly, after having a set struck off.
