I understand that you are very much interested in seeing the cane industry in Florida take its proper place in the business of this State.

I have a farm of 550 acres which adjoins the City limits on the east side, of this tract about four hundred acres are deep drained MUCK all fenced and crossed fenced, and ready for plowing.

This soil is fine for growing cane, as I have demonstrated but I was not able to develop the industry as it needed to be done. At the present time I have it leased out for pasture, but it should be in Cultivation in cane for Syrup.

I would be pleased to go in with some one in cultivating this farm, as I believe a great success can be made making syrup. It would need a tractor plow and a man who understood what he was doing so as to go at it in the proper way.

If you are ever down this way and feel interested I wish you would call and we will go over the land and discuss the developing of this business I have the land, and location for a great business, but am not able to finance and manage the business, but would like to see it done.

The inclosed plat will show you the situation,- my farm is KISSIMMEE GARDENS and what has been sold off does not hurt the Muck land part for Syrup, a tractor could plow a furrow a mile long if he so wished.

If you are interested in syrup making I believe you will find my proposition worth investigating.
