Dear Sir:

Please pardon this letter coming to you from a stranger. Recently I noticed a report of some Seminole Indians of Oklahoma who were going on a mission to see you about an old treaty, or rather an old grant of land given them they claim in 1859. Our Society does not know what facts this claim is based upon nor what consideration you will give the matter of course.

The Seminoles Indians living in Florida we do know, and we know th them to be worthy of confidence and really a splended people. Very Moral honest and peaceful. Our Florida Legislature granted and set aside a tract of 90,000. acres for the use and benefit of these Indians in 1917.

Our United States Government has provided about 25,000 acres as a reservation for these Indians here in Florida but they are no fourced to live upon it. The Government has recently fenced about 18000 acres for them to engage in the cattle raising industry. I mention these facts to show you what we who know the Seminoles think of them.

If the Oklaahoma Seminoles want to come to Mexico, you will doubtless find them worthy of any assistance you may feel like giving to them to come and live under your flag. This letter is written without their knowledge or request and entirely voluntary upon the part of the writer to acquaint you with the character of the Seminole Indians as we know them from a long acquaintance with many of their tribe.

Any concessions you may feel like granting to the Seminoles who may wish to move to your country I believe you will find worthily bestowed.
