I am sorry we did not get your letter sooner. I am still interested in getting the Seminoles' land back. I wish to thank you for your letter of April 15th. Stating your Committee was investigating the wording of the bill granting the land to the Seminoles.

Mr. Vans-Agnew is the only attorney who succeeded in getting Mr. P.A. Vans-Agnew Attorney of Winter Park Fla. into the Executive Committee. He believes as you do that it is important to have the Seminoles back on their lands. When I wrote you the first time I had forgotten about the wording of the bill, and didn't look it up and read it over. Mr. Vans-Agnew told me he was talking with Congressman Sears about getting the Seminoles provided with cattle after the land is fenced, - that is their holdings near Immakalee. With raising cattle, and bananas growing, our Seminoles friends would be in a way fixed to make a living.
