We expect to have about 100 Seminole Indians at the Collier County Fair. They will occupy an Indian village built by them, as an adjunct to the Fair.

We do not believe that any of them reads or writes. If you desire to send some communication to them, we would suggest that you write us, and we will attempt to convey your message.

Their camps in the woods are at a considerable distance from Everglades, and it would be very difficult to reach the villages except on foot from the nearest point on the road.

We have a weekly newspaper, the Collier County News, copy of which we take pleasure in forwarding you under separate cover.
